Fourth grade students will develop a passion for reading, increase stamina, and improve comprehension through individualized strategy work in their reading response journals during reading workshop. In math, students will gain a deep knowledge of 4th grade math standards through rigorous problem solving and sharing solutions in math workshop.

The School Will:

- Provide reading response journals to improve reading comprehension and strategy work.
- Maintain a grade level blog with websites, games, and instructional videos to address classroom goals.
- Provide parents with resources such as unit based math newsletters to solve math problems.

The Parent Will:

- Provide a daily reading time, encouraging their student to use comprehension strategies to think about their reading.
- Review the grade level blog and use the support materials to support my student as he/she completes homework assignments.
- Use the resources provided by the school to support my student as he/she develops as a mathematician.



- Use my reading response journal to record strategies and improve my reading comprehension.
- Use grade level blog, web sites, and games to practice math and reading skills.
- Practice math strategies to solve word problems with operations such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.
